The Epistle to the Galatians Lesson #2 • Galatians 1:6-12 Paul's Abrupt Change of Attitude • HANDOUT •

Galatians 1:6-7 [NLT] • I am shocked that you are turning away so soon from God, who called you to Himself through the loving mercy of Christ. You are following a different way that pretends to be the Good News but is not the Good News at all. You are being fooled by those who deliberately twist the truth concerning Christ.

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Q:	In his other letters, when Paul gave criticism he did so using non-abrasive language which sought to be both thought-provoking and amiable. Why has Paul deviated from his usual choice of words and instead uses language that is blunt and challenging?
Q:	What does Paul say about the belief-system the Galatians seemed to be about to embrace?
Q:	What is significant about Paul's statement that it is God, who calls us to Himself through the loving mercy of Christ . Wasn't it <u>God's mercy</u> that gave us Christ?
Q:	Why does Paul call these people in Galatia "deserters?"
Q:	Where does Paul lay the blame? Who does he say is responsible for this attack against the Gospel?
Q:	What is it that those who are attacking the Gospel message want to accomplish in Galatia?
Q:	What would be accomplished by combining Christianity and Judaism?

Paul now pronounces a solemn curse on those who teach a false gospel ...

<u>Galatians 1:8-9</u> • But even if we, or an angel from heaven, should preach a gospel other than the one we preached to you, let him be eternally condemned!

As we have already said, so now I say again: If anybody is preaching to you a gospel other than what you accepted, let him be eternally condemned!

Having established why his has written this letter, Paul now asks an important question ...

Galatians 1:10 • Am I now trying to win the approval of men, or of God? Or am I trying to please men? If I were still trying to please men, I would not be a servant of Christ.

- Q: Why would Paul even broach the question about whom he was trying to please with his preaching?
- Q: Is Paul contradicting himself in this regard in 1 Corinthians 9?
 - ▶1 Corinthians 9:19-23 Even though I am a free man with no master, I have become a slave to all people to bring many to Christ. When I was with the Jews, I lived like a Jew to bring the Jews to Christ. When I was with those who follow the Jewish law, I too lived under that law. Even though I am not subject to the law, I did this so I could bring to Christ those who are under the law. When I am with the Gentiles who do not follow the Jewish law, I too live apart from that law so I can bring them to Christ. But I do not ignore the law of God; I obey the law of Christ. When I am with those who are weak, I share their weakness, for I want to bring the weak to Christ. Yes, I try to find common ground with everyone, doing everything I can to save some. I do everything to spread the Good News and share in its blessings.
- Q: What is Paul's ultimate argument on the issue of him being a man-pleaser?

The next two verses represent Paul's first important thesis of this letter...

Galatians 1:11-12 \cdot I want you to know, brothers, that the gospel I preached is not something that man made up. I did not receive it from any man, nor was I taught it; rather, I received it by revelation from Jesus Christ.

Q:	What is significant about Paul opening this passage with "I want you to know, brothers?"
Q:	What is the origin, the source of the Gospel Paul preached?
Q:	Paul denies what three possible sources for his teaching?
