"Hitler's promises that attracted Germans to the Nazi Party included restoring German dignity and greatness, returning to traditional values and forms of governance, re-establishing male dominance and home-bound women, withdrawing from the League of Nations, opposing communism, discarding the Versailles Treaty, and blaming Jews and internationalists for Germany's problems. He also pledged to provide jobs, food, and prosperity amid the economic crisis of the Great Depression. These promises appealed to many Germans who were overwhelmed by rapid social and economic changes."

"The Soviet concept of power requires that the Party leadership remain in theory the sole repository of truth. ... The leadership of the Communist Party is therefore always right." Since "they alone knew what was good for society"—and since their word was "absolute," "immutable," "infallible," "secure and unchallengeable"—the Soviet leadership was "prepared to recognize no restrictions, either of God or man, on the character of their methods."¹

Thus the hypocrisy and irony of Marx's disciples professing official atheism as they blindly adhered to their philosophy like religious zealots. And yet, Lenin affirmed Marx's sentiment that communism begins where atheism begins. He considered atheism a natural and inseparable part of Marxism, of the theory and practice of "scientific socialism."263 "Religion is opium for the people," said Lenin, echoing Marx. "Religion is a sort of spiritual booze."²

How could the people have been so blind? Poverty and ignorance have always been a target for socialists and communists, but what is even worse is that many of our legislators in our nation have used these also as weapons to sway votes.

Hitler fomented outrage and discontent. He endorsed a public referendum backing the "Liberty Law," proposed legislation that called for the abrogation of the Treaty of

Versailles.³ The German signatories to the treaty were to be executed for treason, along with any government official who implemented the treaty's provisions that included onerous reparation payments. It was reported, falsely, that the German government was drafting German teenagers and selling them into slavery abroad to service reparation debts. Hitler sowed lies and hatred, and harvested votes.

Does this sound familiar?

Lenin decried "this or that dope by the established church. Complete separation of church and state is what the socialist proletariat demands of the modern state and the modern church." Sounding like a twenty-first-century secular progressive in America, Lenin insisted that "religion must be declared a private affair."266 Like Bukharin and other Bolsheviks, he demanded an ironclad "separation of church and state."267⁴

Many Americans have grown up being taught that we cannot discuss religion and politics together. Over the years, this has become a copout for many claiming to be Christians who do not want to be challenged about their opinions. In chapter one of Romans, Paul says, "I am not ashamed of the Gospel." What does our Bible say about where our attention is to be focused first? Matthew 6:33: "But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you." Is this not clear, how then can any believer not balance everything in their lives from the moral foundation of our Great God? How can one support that which God has called evil? Oh, the promises sound so sweet, so encouraging; I can feel it now: a new home, a new car, won't need to work as hard. Lie, lies, and more lies. Ecclesiastes 1:2: "Vanity of vanities," says the Preacher; "Vanity of vanities, all is vanity." We look to the world to find success,

"abolition of religion." Given what he had said in the previous line, he thus said (not surprisingly) that "the abolition of religion" is necessary for people to achieve "real happiness," especially given that their clinging to religion (to borrow a description from Barack Obama, who in 2008 spoke sneeringly of Americans "clinging to their God") is a mere "illusory happiness." It was hence critical, said Marx, that the likes of him criticize religion because religion was the "halo" of a "vale of tears."⁵

Undeserved Persecution

"Richard Wurmbrand was a pastor who endured fourteen years of hell in a Romanian prison. He detailed some of the unspeakable cruelty he witnessed in testimony before the US Congress and in his widely read Tortured for Christ, first published in 1967. "Thousands of believers from churches of all denominations were sent to prison at that time," remembered Wurmbrand. "Not only were clergymen put in jail, but also simple peasants, young boys, and girls who witnessed for their faith. The prisons were full, and in Romania, as in all communist countries, to be in prison means to be tortured." He recalled the example of one pastor: A pastor by the name of Florescu was tortured with red-hot iron pokers and with knives. He was beaten very badly. Then starving rats were driven into his cell through a large pipe. He could not sleep because he had to defend himself all the time. If he rested a moment, the rats would attack him. He was forced to stand for two weeks, day and night. ... Eventually, they brought his fourteen-year-old son to the prison and began to whip the boy in front of his father, saying that they would continue to beat him until the pastor said what they wished him to say. The poor man was half mad. He bore it as long as he could, then he cried to his son, "Alexander, I must say what they want! I can't bear your beating anymore!" The son answered, "Father, don't do me the injustice of having a traitor as a parent. Withstand! If they kill me, I will die with the words, 'Jesus and my fatherland'." The communists, enraged, fell upon the child and beat him to death, with blood spattered over the walls of the cell. He died praising God. Our dear brother Florescu was never the same after seeing this."⁶

The picture I am painting is one of truth, the truth that far too many in our nation have never been taught and have never spoken with one who lived through the atrocities of socialism and communism. Many today, primarily our youth have not known any of this and so they buy into the lie. We see the protestors on the streets of American doing what would be certain death in other nations. Our next generations need to know the past, what I have written here is but a minute amount of what has been and is still out there, even here in America.

Where is the church?

"In the fourth place—the most important thing of all—there must be a renewal of Christian education. The rejection of Christianity is due to various causes. But a very potent cause is simple ignorance. In countless cases, Christianity is rejected simply because men have not the slightest notion of what Christianity is. An outstanding fact of recent Church history is the appalling growth of ignorance in the Church. Various causes, no doubt, can be assigned for this lamentable development. The development is due partly to the general decline of education—at least so far as literature and history are concerned. The schools of the present day are being ruined by the absurd notion

that education should follow the line of least resistance, and that something can be "drawn out" of the mind before anything is put in. They are also being ruined by an exaggerated emphasis on methodology at the expense of content and on what is materially useful at the expense of the high spiritual heritage of mankind. These lamentable tendencies, moreover, are in danger of being made permanent through the sinister extension of state control. But something more than the general decline in education is needed to account for the special growth of ignorance in the Church."⁷

Man made for God. Christianity and Liberalism

"Very different is the prevailing doctrine of modern liberalism. According to Christian belief, man exists for the sake of God; according to the liberal Church, in practice if not in theory, God exists for the sake of man.

But the social element in Christianity is found not only in communion between man and God, but also in communion between man and man. Such communion appears even in institutions which are not specifically Christian. The most important of such institutions, according to Christian teaching, is the family. And that institution is being pushed more and more into the background. It is being pushed into the background by undue encroachments of the community and of the state. Modern life is tending more and more toward the contraction of the sphere of parental control and parental influence. The choice of schools is being placed under the power of the state; the "community" is seizing hold of recreation and of social activities. It may be a question how far these community activities are responsible for the modern breakdown of the home; very possibly they are only trying to fill a void which even apart from them had already appeared. But the result at any rate is plain—the lives of children are no longer surrounded by the loving atmosphere of the Christian home, but by the utilitarianism of the state."⁸

The constitutionality of voters' rights. Section 1 of the 14th amendment.

"All persons born or naturalized in the United States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens of the United States and of the State wherein they reside. No State shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any State deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws."

We can read this plainly and clearly, yet the current DOJ has taken the states to court over this in the past week and a half. If you think the liberal side of our nation, those pointing the figure all the while doing the very things they claim of their opponents, have
